

Strawberry Varieties

Information Provided By Fall Creek Farm & Nursery

The following list represents some of the items currently grown at our nursery. We have too many plants to list every variety. If there is something you want that is not on the list please call the nursery at (509) 662-2036. We have plants in all phases of production, and we order in ones that we may have sold out of.

Tribute (Everbearing): Medium to large wedge shaped berries with bright red skin, firm, light to medium flesh. Acidic but pleasant flavor; best for fresh eating and good processing quality. Produces a good midseason spring crop that is resistant to Red Stele, Powdery Mildew, Leaf Blight and Leaf Scorch. The size of the berry may drop in the heat of the summer but will return with good flavor in the cooler fall weather.

Fort Laramie (Everbearing): Large, bright scarlet fruit with dark pink to scarlet interior. The firm sweet flesh is exceptionally aromatic and good for eating fresh, freezing and preserving. Extremely winter hardy, produces a lot of runners and very heavy crop. Somewhat susceptible to mildew.

Rainier (Spring Crop): A very tough virus tolerant plant. It is an extremely vigorous grower with large floppy leaves that are ornamentally attractive. The berry is medium to large in size and conic in shape. A fairly soft berry, Rainier is excellent for fresh eating as well as processing. Hood (Spring Crop): The large round berry is considered to have the best table quality. It is also known best as a fine preserve and jam berry, and is good for all other uses. It bears the entire crop over a short period. It is resistant to Root Rot, Mildew and Red Stele, but is quite susceptible to virus and should not be planted near strawberries known to be virused.

Eversweet (Everbearing): Large berry that is exceptionally flavorful. Produces well all summer and into fall. Tolerates temperatures over 100°F without loss of fruit quality. Has good disease resistance

Shuksan (Spring Crop): Produces large glossy fruit with bright red, tough skin. It is a firm berry that is good quality for freezing, jams and jellies, and fresh eating. Late producer with large crops. Tolerates alkaline soil and is extra cold hardy.

Totem (Spring Crop): Early producer of bright red, firm, medium sized, conic shaped berries. Excellent for eating fresh, freezing and processing. It is one of the hardiest and most disease resistant varieties, but does not tolerate alkaline soils.

Tillamook (Spring Crop): A high-yielding producer of large, bright red berries. The fruit is firm and has a very good fresh flavor. Vigorous plants that hold up well. Good for you-pick markets.

Sequoia (Spring Crop): Produces very large, dark red berries with very good flavor. It is one of the earliest producers with an extremely long season. Does not have a long shelf life, but it can be used for freezing.
